



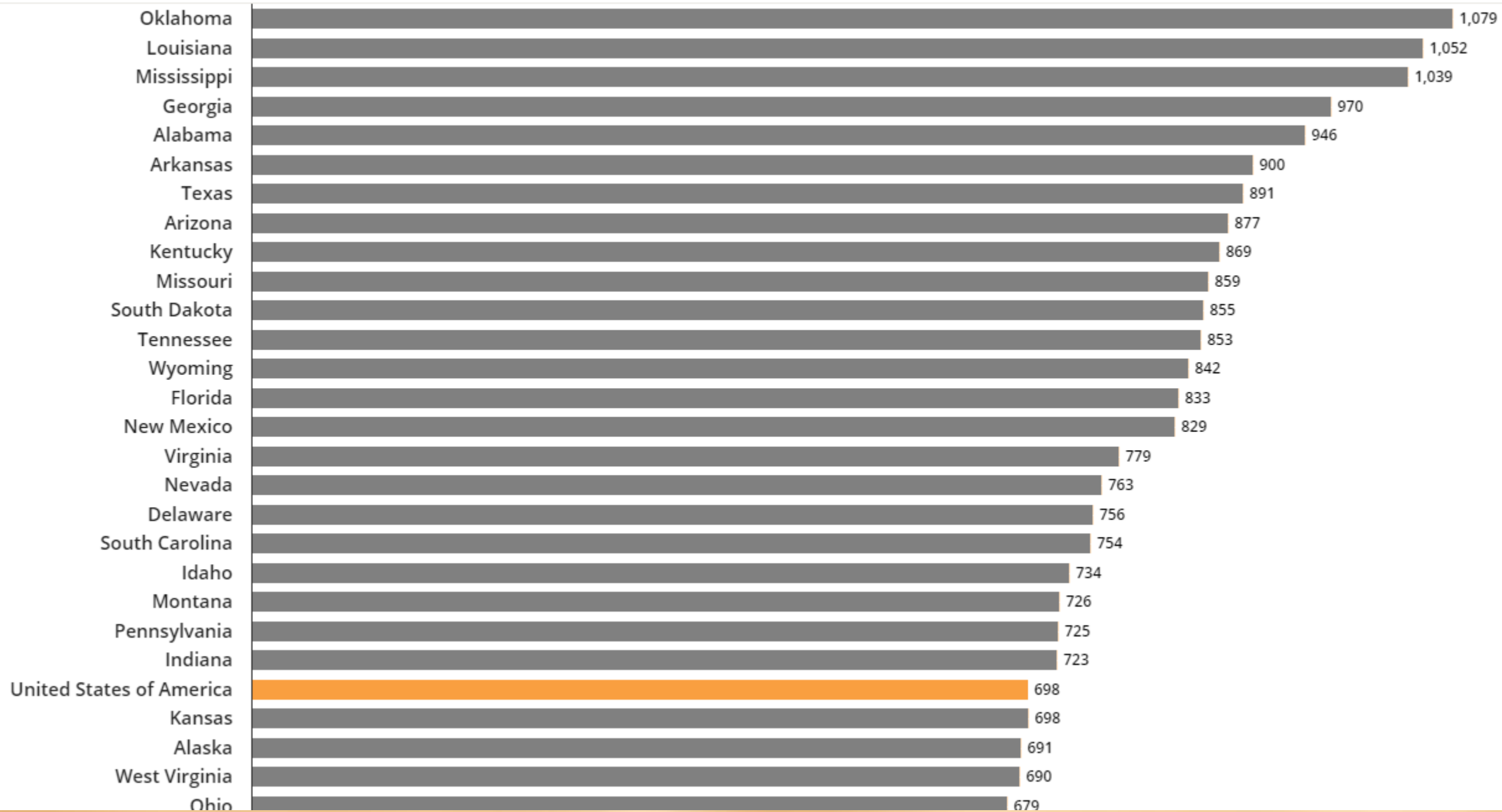

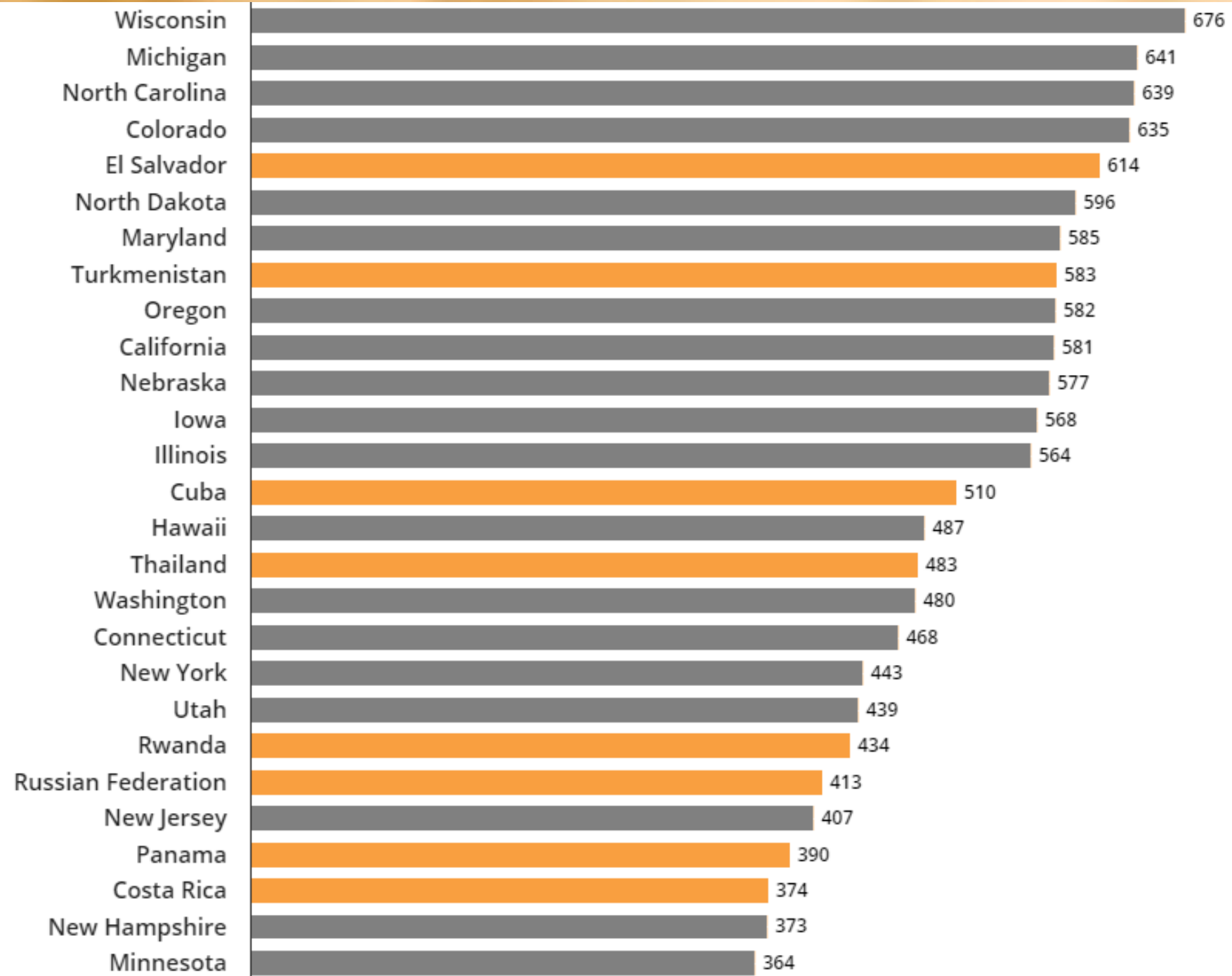

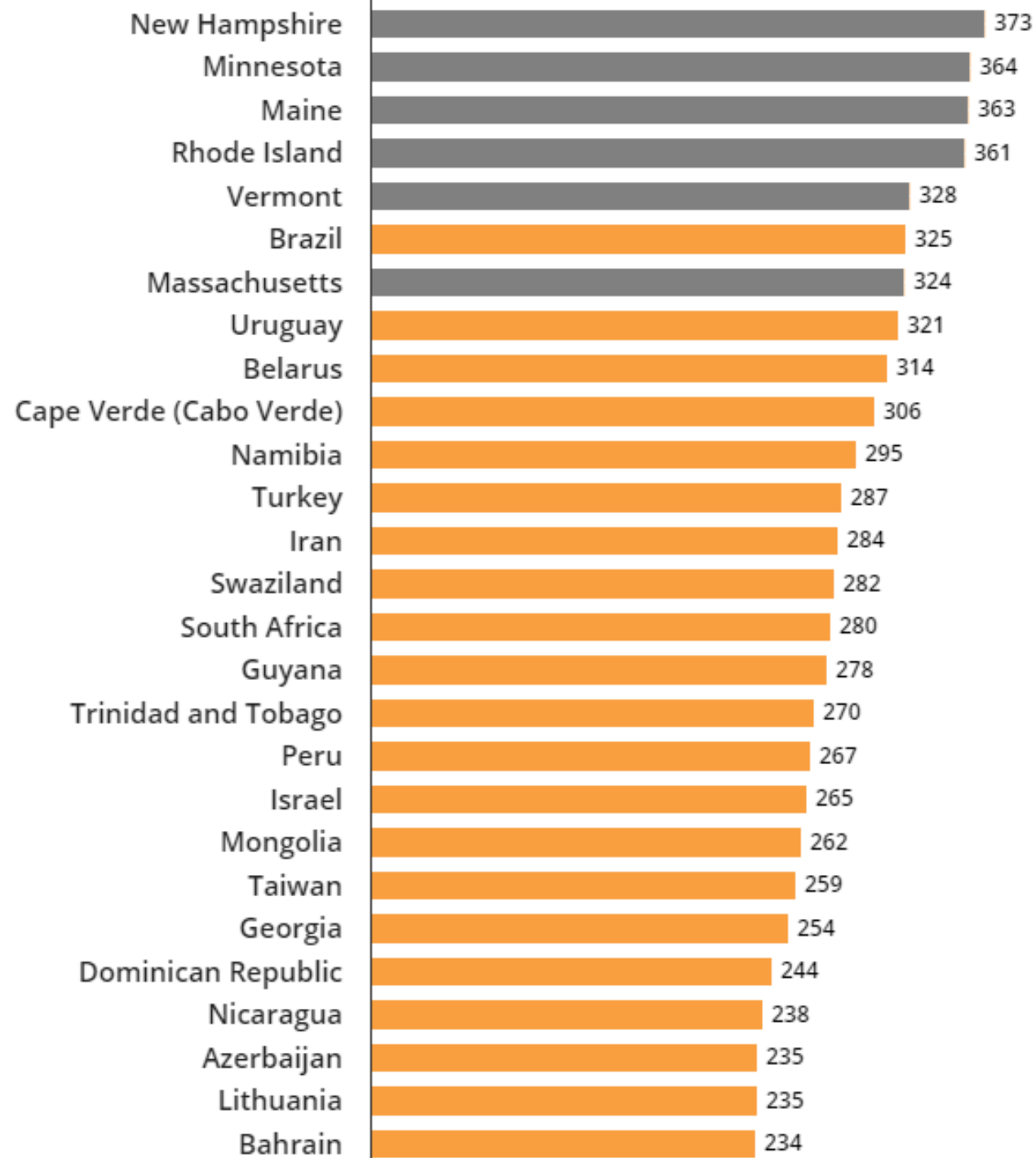
The Data Perspective

New Hampshire has an incarceration rate of **373 per 100,000 people** (including prisons, jails, immigration detention, and juvenile justice facilities), meaning that it locks up a higher percentage of its people than many wealthy democracies

World Incarceration Rates If Every U.S. State Were A Country

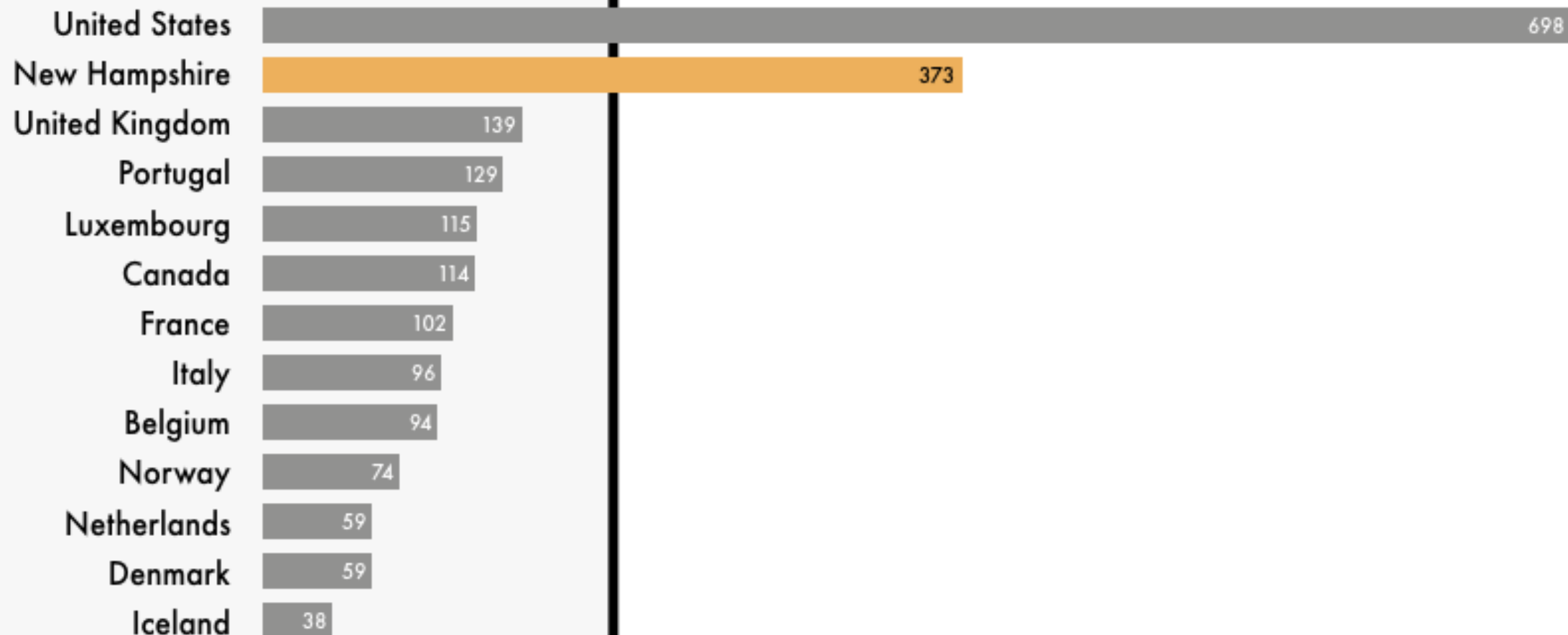

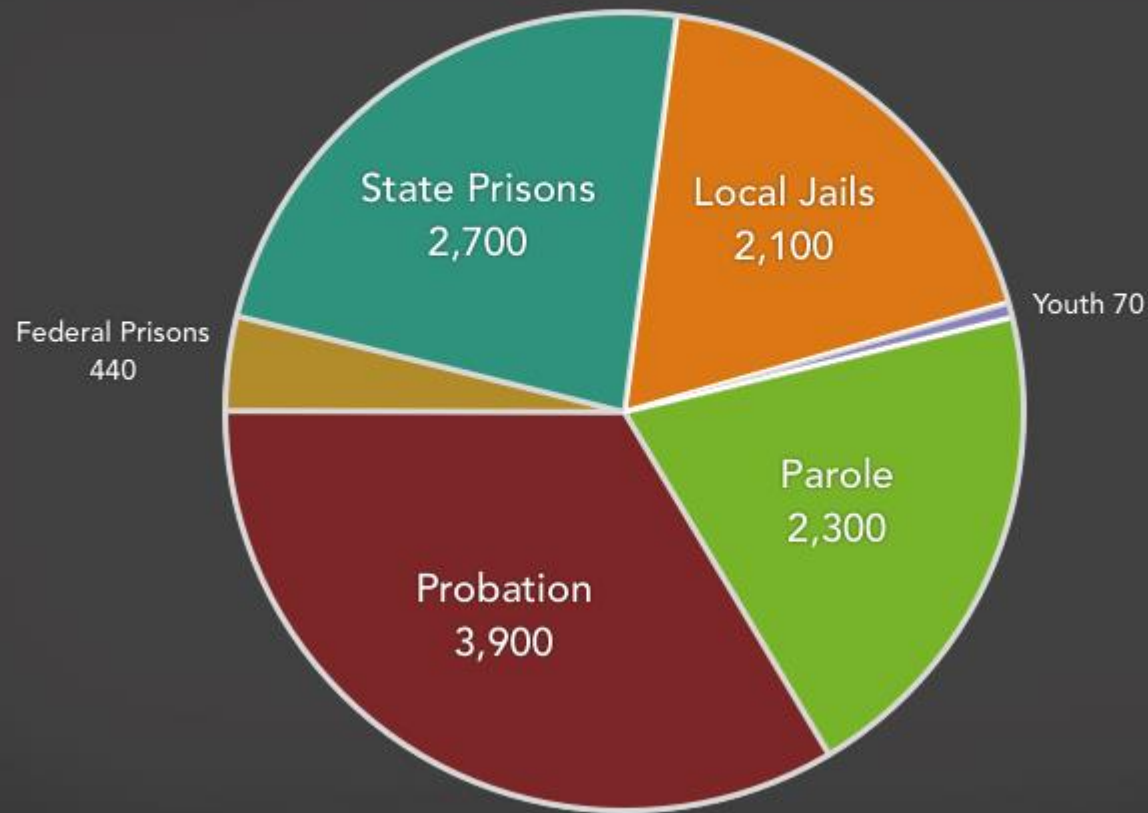


Incarceration rates per 100,000 population

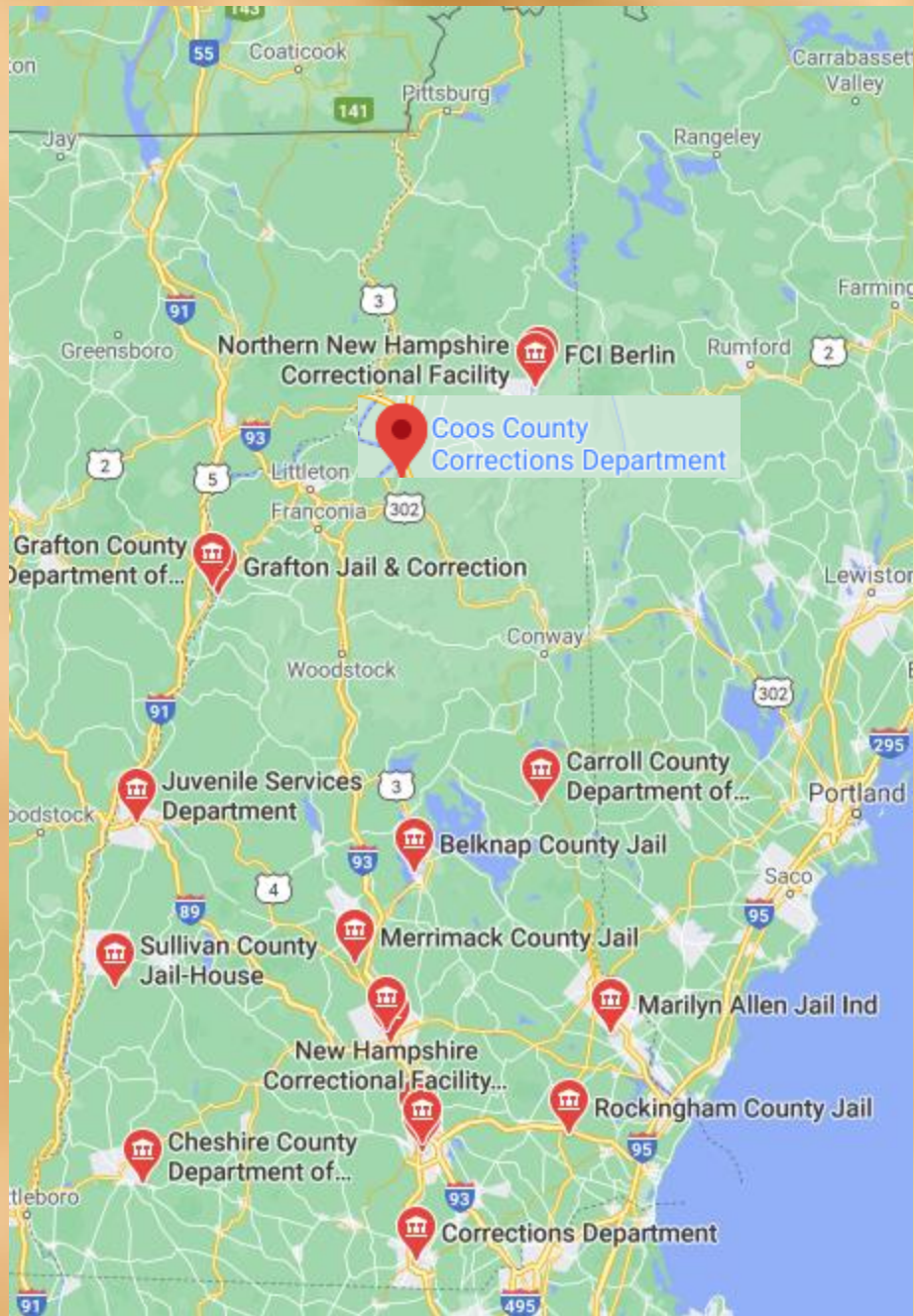

How many people are in New Hampshire's criminal justice system?

12,000 New Hampshire residents are behind bars or under criminal justice supervision.



Additionally, the number of people impacted by **county and city jails** in New Hampshire is much larger than the graph above would suggest, because people cycle through local jails **relatively quickly**. Each year, **at least 25,000 different people** are booked into local jails in New Hampshire.

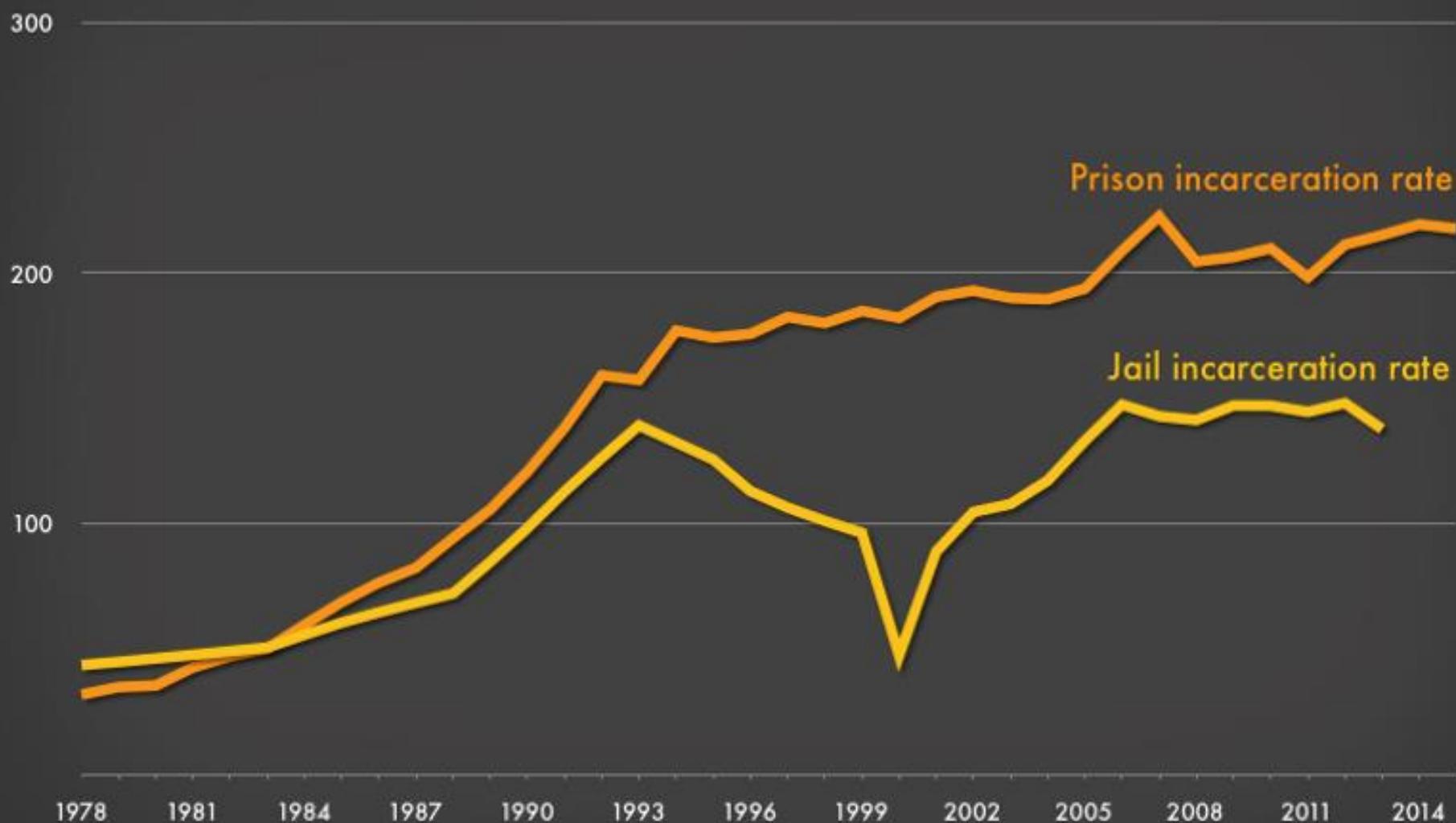

Whites are underrepresented in the incarcerated population while Blacks, Latinos and American Indians are overrepresented.

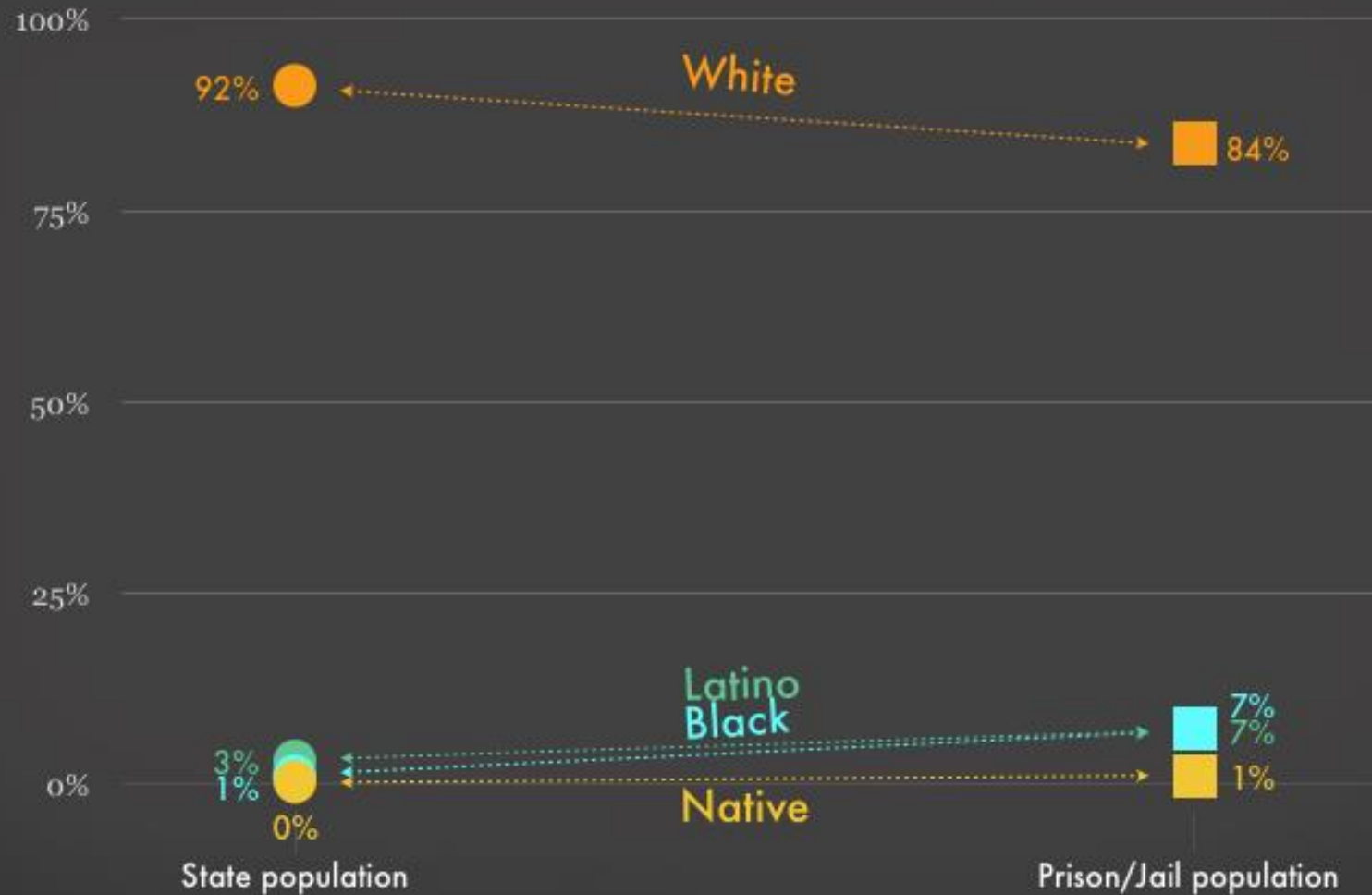


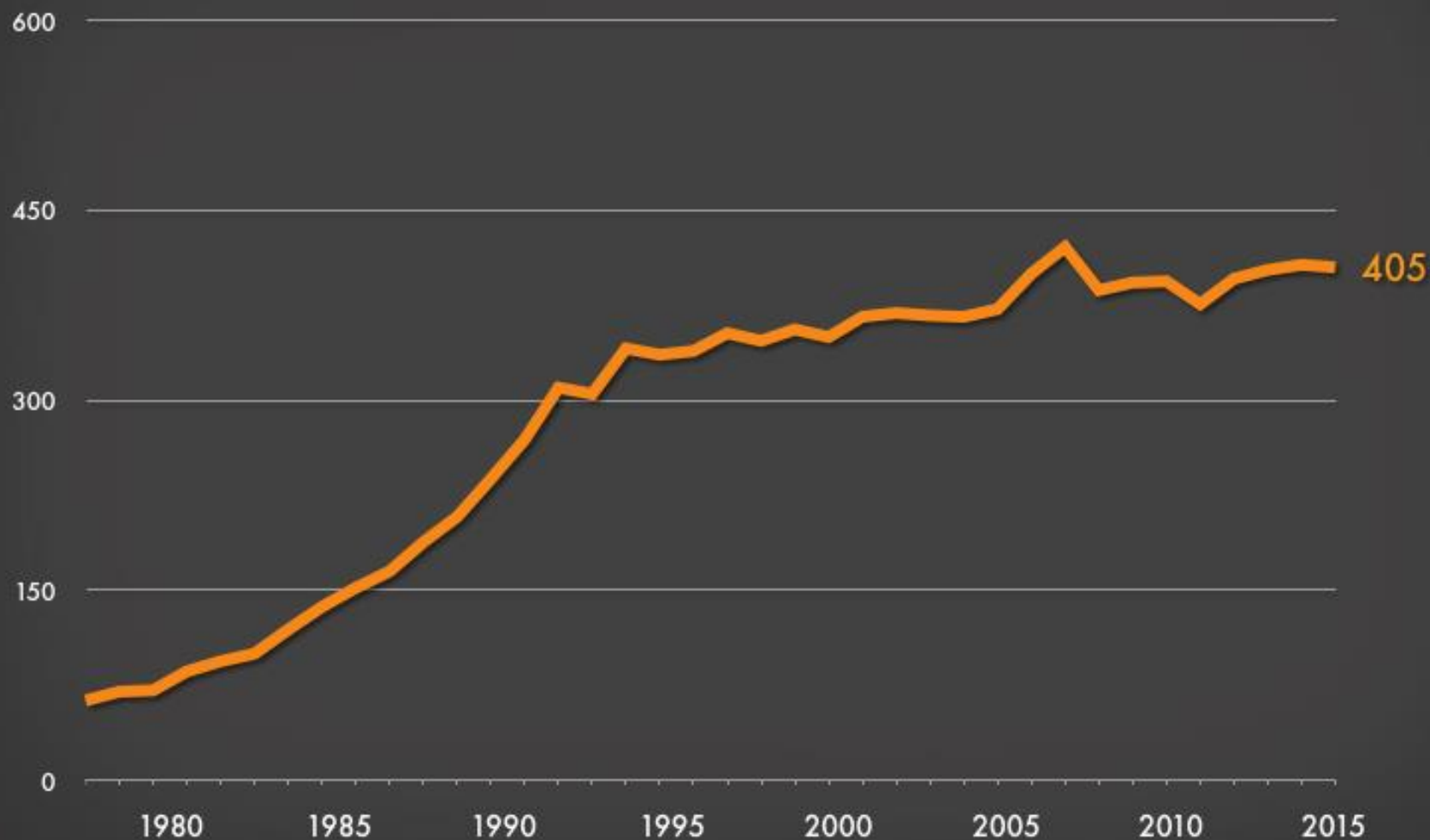

Number of men incarcerated in New Hampshire prisons per 100,000 male residents, 1978-2015

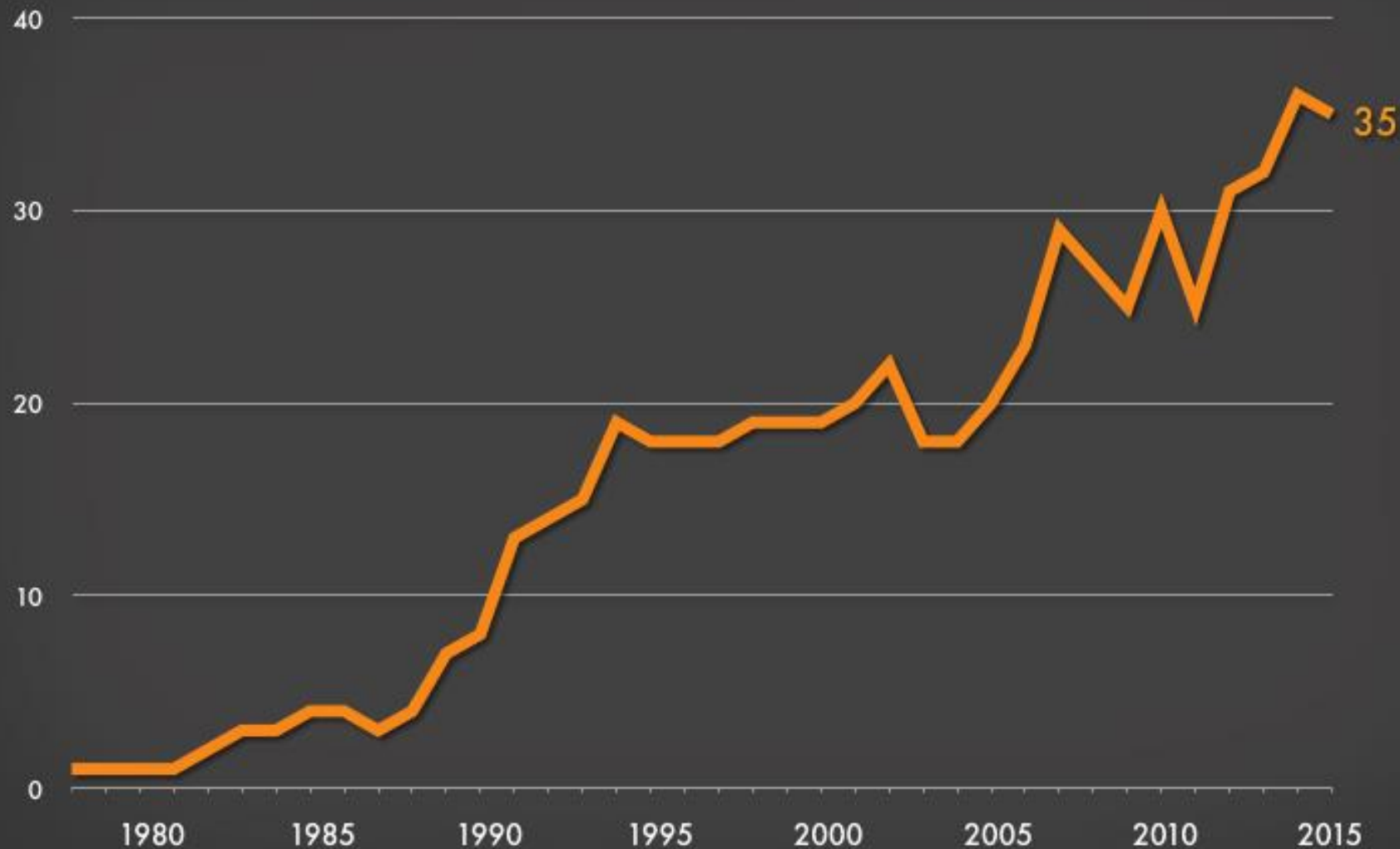
