
Assisting with Worship Kin Group IV, Lucy Mueller Deacon Charlie Foss reading the scripture

Climate Ambassador Training



How do we link our faith to the climate crisis? How do we effectively talk about climate change with others? What opportunities do we have to make a difference in our local churches and communities?

October 29th Milk with Dignity Action in New London

To continue to implore Hannaford to get on board for dairy worker rights, please join in a signholding rally along Newport Road near the New London Hannaford for any/all of the noon-2pm period on Saturday, October 29.

We'll be showing Hannaford that we community members/customers care about migrant dairy farm workers in their supply chain—and that we want Hannaford to do the same by joining the Milk With Dignity program.

Save the Monarchs – Plant Some Milkweed Seeds



Yes, the monarch is slip-sliding toward being endangered, but we can do something about it.

One problem is habitat loss, the key feature being the loss of milkweed plants. Milkweed is the one plant crucial to monarchs thriving.

At the back of the sanctuary in coming Sundays, you'll find a box of milkweed pods, which can be planted by you, your neighbors, or your friends. Each pod contains quite a few seeds, so a pod can go a long way.

Grab a few (bags are provided) and a list of pollen-rich flowers which monarchs love. We loosened 1-2" of soil and made sure the seeds were covered, which gave good results for us. You can no doubt find more specific planting instructions online or in a recent article in both the Concord Monitor and Valley News. God's creation will take it from there.

Because we planted with intention last fall, we still have more to harvest, so we'll replenish the box as best we can. As we've learned, a newly-hatched monarch is a pleasure to behold.

Calendars and pocket calendars (very popular!) are permitted as long as they **do not have a spiral binding, and do not have pictures of children or weapons**.

Collection boxes are now at the rear of the sanctuary, and downstairs by the fellowship hall entrance. Thank you!
